## Counseling Ministry Rev. Jay Close, Pastoral Counselor

#### How's your trust?

Trust is putting your well-being in another's hands, believing they are on your side, working for your benefit. To trust someone can be a risk of being hurt or overlooked. In relationships, hopefully you are also trustworthy. When there is a track record of mutual trust, it is a beautiful thing with lots of benefits.

Trust is so important that people notice when it is not present. Sometimes we take it for granted when trust is there, but it becomes painfully obvious when it is not. When you don't feel you can trust someone you feel ill at ease. The risk of telling them something vulnerable is too great, cooperating with them on tasks to be done has some danger. Trust is so powerful that it makes everything go more smoothly and its absence gums up the works in marriages, friendships, and businesses.

The book, "The Speed of Trust," by Stephen M. R. Covey says everything goes better and faster when trust is present. The opposite is true as well, everything goes more poorly and slower when trust is not present. Without trust, people can't be totally honest with each other because they don't know what the other will do with the information. The time it takes to figure out what is safe to say or do, slows everything down.

Think about the people you have complete trust in; there is comfort. Now think of those folks, who as the saying goes, you "don't trust them as far as you could throw them," (you don't trust them much). To build trust we need to ask for what we want in relationships, then see if the person will give it. We must also be people of our word with kindness; being trustworthy.

May our relationships now and in the future be trustworthy. And may we be trustworthy people.



#### **INCLEMENT WEATHER POLICY**

A decision will be made by 8 a.m. if worship is cancelled.

If it is determined that the church will need to close, the information will be available on local TV stations: WAVE 3, WHAS 11, WLKY 32 and WDRB 41.

- Note: Sometimes that information is delayed, due to the large number of churches calling in to report their closings.
- We will also post the cancellation on FBC's Facebook page and an email will be sent.

Cancellation of Wednesday night activities will be determined that day and an email will be sent with an update of the status.
